

"He knows all, sees all, hears all," golden words of wisdom spoken many centuries ago, are still applicable in this modern age for our principal, Roy W. Greer.


"He knows all." Mr. Greer's knowledge of student activities seems unending. The new activities he has introduced this year will have a permanent place in the years to come.


"He sees all." Quick to notice infractions of school rules, Mr. Greer has also proved himself an accurate and fair judge of student character.

Mr. Greer's job has not been an easy one this year, but in his fair consideration of student problems, he has won the admiration of both the faculty and the students.












